Counter-transference and the Racial Complex

The cultural complex Jung spoke of as 'under the skin' of white Americans, has come to the surface. Toni Morrison wrote of the jungle white folks planted in black people, spreading until it invaded the whites who made it. As we begin to see the truth we become responsible for it. If we consider that race is always in the room, we have both the good fortune, and the responsibility to address how the racial complex operates within the psyche. This workshop is for each of us to begin the dialogue with our racial, cultural complex and the transference relationship.

He taught at Antioch University's graduate Psych program for 17 years, and is a long time member of the JPA. He has presented at the Jung Society, Bastyr College and the JPA. Currently he is very involved in the Breaking White Silence affinity group, which supports white racial literacy consciousness raising study groups and trains and consults for facilitators of these groups. With his wife and colleague, Cathy, he offers Breaking White Silence study groups for colleagues.
